Students Advocate and Influence Culturallyrich Education in their Schools

Student leadership and action in San Antonio and Houston schools led to remarkable gains. This article tells two stories about the importance of courses that reinforce the culture and heritage of diverse students.

In San Antonio, students took steps to get a Mexican American Studies (MAS) class re-established in their school. They were able to show the high level of interest and determination of students to learn about the histories and contributions of various cultural groups that shape the United States. In Houston, a different group of students organized to reverse the cancellation of a mariachi class.



The stories demonstrate that young individuals are capable of not only identifying gaps in their education but also taking proactive steps to bridge those gaps.

IDRA School Resource Hub Provides Tools for Teaching About Race and Gender

IDRA's award-winning We All Belong – School Resource Hub was designed to help educators feel supported in their work in today's climate of classroom censorship that has made it difficult for educators to provide an accurate and inclusive education for all their students.



In the midst of Hispanic Heritage Month, a group of ethnic studies teachers and advocates reviewed a lesson available through the hub, "Jovita Idar – Educator, Journalist, Suffragist & Civil Rights Activist" by Unladylike2020.

IDRA developed the hub by listening to teachers and students who want lessons on history and current events about race and gender to help provide context to the discrimination they experienced. Today, the hub features over 120 lesson plans, instructional best practices and historical resources. Highlights include lessons on Mexican American Studies and the new "American Is Me" (AIM) framework for teaching intercultural skills useful across all academic areas.

Texas Legislative Education Equity Coalition Policy and Advocacy in 2023

The Texas Legislative Education Equity Coalition (TLEEC) is a collaborative of more than 30 organizations and individuals working to improve the quality of public education for all children, with a focus on racial justice. IDRA founded the coalition in 2001 and has co-led TLEEC with Every Texan and fellow founding member MALDEF for more than 20 years.



During this spring's legislative session, TLEEC's two main policy priorities were protecting and increasing funding for schools and promoting inclusive P-20+ school climates.

TLEEC members and partner organizations successfully mounted a strong campaign against private school vouchers. But as vouchers will re-emerge as a top priority for the governor and legislators in a third expected session beginning October 9, the coalition remains unwavering in its stance that public funds should remain in public schools.


