The initiative will build a data-driven, statewide policy agenda that improves the quality and equity of early childhood



programs, care facilities and early grade programs for Texas' youngest English learner students, ages 0-8 years old. It will use research, stakeholder conversations and robust policy analysis to build an agenda that we can advance during the 2021 Texas Legislative session. Policy recommendations will be released in late 2020.

"The COVID-19 pandemic and resulting closure of school and childcare facilities have had severe implications for English learner access to effective and equitable bilingual education

instruction," said IDRA President & CEO Celina Moreno. "We are excited to help lead this collaborative work to ensure young English learner children have the best start in schooling possible."
